#### **Decisions and/or Recommendations**

The June 26 web meeting served as a forum for MAC Scorecard Committee members to discuss strategic themes which arose during key informant interviews with four state medical directors in March 2019. CMCS sought input on the MAC Scorecard composition and the relationship between the Core Sets and the MAC Scorecard. Four themes arose during the interviews:

- 1. Medicaid and CHIP populations impacted by MAC Scorecard measures;
- 2. Considerations/recommendations for MAC Scorecard composition;
- 3. Accountability; and
- 4. Practical/technical considerations.

This discussion focused on the fourth theme above. Committee members discussed that accountability for the Scorecard should be separated from legal obligations (i.e., Americans with Disabilities Act). The Committee felt accountability should go above and beyond current legal rights and should focus on quality improvement. Accountability should be separated into two groups: (1) Fundamental Measures (required of all states) and (2) Flexible Measures (measures states select based on their individual needs). Finally, the Committee felt that accountability should be shared by providers, states, and health plans. The Committee did not put forth formal decisions or recommendations.
