

Call for Nominations

BACKGROUND

Healthcare performance measurement is essential to ensuring safe, cost-effective, high-quality care. Using standardized metrics to assess processes and outcomes of care can help healthcare providers improve the services they provide, allow patients to make informed choices about their care, and aid payers in building provider networks and paying appropriately. However, reducing the burden of measurement is important to ensuring stakeholder buy-in and the effectiveness of measurement. One strategy to reduce burden is to identify which measures should be prioritized for implementation across payers.

The Core Quality Measures Collaborative (CQMC), a multistakeholder collaborative with representation from various specialty organizations as well as public and private payers across the healthcare landscape, developed measure core sets that demonstrate an industry commitment to advancing healthcare quality while simultaneously creating substantial opportunities and pathways for burden reduction by facilitating agreement on relevant measures.

Over a 12-month period of performance, NQF will use a multistakeholder approach to develop an Implementation Guide for the CQMC core sets. The Implementation Guide will address technical aspects of core set implementation for payment and quality reporting purposes and aim to encourage buy-in among clinicians, provider facilities, and consumers by raising awareness and increasing stakeholder knowledge of the core sets.

COMMITTEE CHARGE

NQF will convene a multistakeholder Committee charged with developing an implementation guide that addresses the following:

- Guidance on technical aspects of core set implementation for payment and quality reporting purposes
- Strategies to encourage buy in among clinicians, provider facilities, and consumers
- Strategies to increase core set adoption to raise awareness and increase stakeholder knowledge

COMMITTEE STRUCTURE

The Committee will include no more than 25 individuals. **Participation on the Committee requires a significant time commitment. To apply, you should be available to participate in all currently scheduled calls/meetings outlined below**. Over the course of 12 months, calls may be rescheduled based on project needs; new dates will be set based on the availability of most of the Committee. Committee participation includes:

- Successfully navigating the technical aspects of implementing measure sets for accountability purposes
- Creating and maintaining multistakeholder buy-in for improvement, measurement, or transformational healthcare initiatives
- Disseminating information with a goal of increased awareness leading to action

CONSIDERATION

Priority will be given to nominations from NQF members when nominee expertise is comparable.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

Nominations are sought for individual subject matter experts. Self-nominations are welcome. Thirdparty nominations must indicate that the individual has been contacted and is willing to serve. To nominate an individual to the Committee, please **submit** the following information:

- A completed online nomination form, including:
 - A brief statement of interest
 - A brief description of nominee expertise highlighting experience relevant to the committee
 - A short biography (maximum 100 words), highlighting experience/knowledge relevant to the expertise described above
 - o Curriculum vitae or list of relevant experience (e.g., publications) up to 20 pages
- A completed disclosure of interest form.
- Confirmation of availability to participate in currently scheduled calls and meeting dates.

All nominations *MUST* be submitted by 6:00 pm ET on Monday, November 25, 2019.
